March is Social Workers Month and we have many social workers on staff who are dedicated to helping children and families improve the quality of their lives through counseling, advocacy and reporting. Our social workers are committed to helping our clients solve and cope with the challenges in their lives and change their lives for the better. We applaud the hard work that our social worker staff does every day in strengthening the voice of children who have been abused or neglected, helping them on their journey to healing and ultimately breaking the cycle of abuse.

We are advancing our Child Abuse Prevention Collaborative (CAP-C) by reaching out to the Medical community with information and education. We will be launching the first prototype at Access Health and are working on a community campaign targeting patients (children) and their caregivers, pediatricians, OB/GYN's and Medical Assistants.

In March, we are hosting our NEST and WINGS children and youth in a Spring Break event focused on giving back to others which builds empathy and perspective that despite what a person may have experienced, as traumatic as it might be, there are others in our community who are also suffering from challenges. We can help these children grow and develop by realizing they are part of a larger community of reciprocal care and gratitude.

Thank you for all you do to advocate and support Child Advocates of Fort Bend and the thousands of children who have been abused and neglect that help to grow, develop and have the chance for a new beginning. I hope to see you at our Sip & Stroll on March 25 and our "Inside Out Gala" On April 26.

The Karyn Purvis Institute of Child Development is a program of the Department of Psychology in the TCU College of Science & Engineering in Fort Worth, Texas. Their mission is: to improve the lives of children through research, education, and outreach that addresses the impact of early abuse, neglect, and trauma. Their research and interventions are empowering parents, professionals, and students with trauma-informed strategies that improve outcomes for children and youth.



Erin Merryn

Erin is an internationally recognized author, speaker, and child abuse advocate and activist. For six years of her childhood she was sexually abused, keeping her secret locked away in her childhood diary. Before graduating high school Erin published her diary into a book called <u>Stolen Innocence</u>.

In 2013 she had Erin's Law passed in her home state of Illinois. The law requires personal body safety taught in public schools every year. She has made it her mission to have it passed in all 50 states. Currently Erin's Law is in 38 states, Kerala, India and Ontario, Canada.

Programming for Children and Youth at CAFB

Child Advocates of Fort Bend seeks innovative methods to provide opportunities for our youth that they may not otherwise encounter. Our specialized programming occurs on a seasonal schedule and the events correspond with school calendar breaks.

The NEST program serves youth ages six to thirteen, focusing on education, health, hygiene, and social interaction. At the end of each school semester, incentive parties are hosted to celebrate our youth's academic and behavioral accomplishments. The NEST Back-to-School program aims to prepare our youth for their return to the classroom with interactive learning experiences and positive social interaction.

The WINGS program serves youth, fourteen and above, with a focus on education, career planning, and daily life skills. Graduation Event celebrates our high school graduates' resilience and all-encompassing achievement. Campus Crawl provides our youth with the opportunity to tour college campuses and meet with advisors who can help actualize their collegiate experience. LifeSkills provides interactive learning modules on financial literacy, job readiness, nutrition, and future living options.

Our WINGS and NEST youth come together for two events each year. Every Spring and Fall Break, we host a joint community service event to encourage our youth to give back to the community that has invested in them.

At the core, our specialized programming exists as an opportunity for healthy connection. We seek to heal the hurt by meeting our youth where they're at and empowering them with the possibility of what could be.

Service

Social Justice

We challenge systems that fail them and advocate for policies that protect them. Social justice is not just an idea, it's the work we do every day to create lasting change.

Dignity and Worth of the Person

Seeing the Strength in Every Child

Trauma does not define a child. Our team recognizes each child's unique strengths and potential, no matter what they've been through. We create a space where they feel valued, where their stories matter, and where they are empowered to heal. We also extend this belief to families, meeting them with compassion and



without judgment, helping them find the support they need.

Importance of Human Relationships Healing Through Connection

A child's journey to healing is never walked alone. Relationships—with caregivers, teachers, friends, and volunteers—are essential. We work to strengthen these connections, helping children rebuild trust and find supportive networks. Whether it's a foster parent stepping in or a volunteer offering extra patience, these relationships are lifelines, and we do everything we can to help nurture them.

Integrity

Doing What's Right, Even When It's Hard

Our work often requires making tough decisions in difficult situations. Integrity means standing firm in our values, even when faced with challenges. It means being transparent with families, honest with colleagues, and always prioritizing a child's well-being above all else. Maybe your stocks have appreciated greatly since you purchased them? Or maybe a surge in the value of one of your holdings over the last year has thrown your portfolio off balance? If this scenario applies to you, it may be an effective and tax-smart opportunity for you to support CAFB and be named as a "Forever Angel" legacy donor.

Most investors are unaware that donating a stock directly to charity is one of the most tax-smart ways to give. By donating a stock that has appreciated more than a year, you are actually giving 20% more to the cause you care about than if you sold the stock and then made a cash donation. The reasonavoiding capital gains taxes.

Donate a stock directly to charity and there's no capital gains tax to pay. Even more good news- you are still eligible to deduct the full fair-market value of the asset you donated from your income taxes. Additionally, appreciated assets can also include assets that are not publicly traded, like restricted stock or Bitcoin.

Financial portfolios, like our health, need a balanced diet. It's a good exercise to periodically consult a financial expert to check to see if it's time to rebalance your portfolio to maximize its performance and optimize for risk. This can be especially important coming off a year of sizeable gains. Implementing a donation strategy can put your capital gains to work funding the philanthropies that are important to you and your family.



TBRI® offers practical tools for parents, caregivers, teachers, or anyone who works with children, to see the "whole child" in their care and help that child reach his highest potential.


TBRI® is an attachment-based, trauma-informed intervention that is designed to meet the complex needs of vulnerable children. The Fort Bend County TBRI Collaborative offers free training for professionals and caregivers who work with children who have experienced trauma.


